CASE STUDY: POLLING PLACES

Every year, millions of Americans vote at polling places. But not everyone goes. In 2012, about 65% of the U.S. population aged 18 and older voted in person at a polling place. About 30% of the population did not vote in person at a polling place.

- About 15% of the population did not vote in person at a polling place because they did not know where to go, did not have time to go, or did not have a valid ID.
- Democrats are more likely than Republicans to vote in person at a polling place. About 70% of Democrats voted in person at a polling place, compared with 58% of Republicans.
- In-person voters are more likely than non-voters to be white, have a college degree, and live in a suburb.
- Democrats are more likely than Republicans to live in a suburb.
