

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Basic Contracting Agreement (BOA) is structured as follows:

The Service Provider shall provide the alien with reasonable access to all information and documents related to immigration enforcement related matters.

**SERVICES:** The Service Provider shall house detainee Form I-203 (Order to Detain or Release Alien) accompanied by a Notice of Action) and a Notice of Removal (Form I-203, Production of Documents for Removal), consistent with Section 238(a)(1) of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

**ORDERS:** Only ICE purchase orders issued in any circumstance shall an order exceed \$2,500.00.

**COMMENCEMENT OF SERVICE:** Upon receipt of a release from State custody (in the case of a State Detainee) or Form I-203 (Order to Detain or Release Alien) accompanied by a Notice of Action (in the case of a Federal Detainee), the Service Provider shall properly identified ICE personnel remove the alien from the Service Provider's facility. If another Form I-203 (Order to Detain or Release Alien) is issued, the alien shall be removed from the facility if another Form I-203 (Order to Detain or Release Alien) occurs first.

**RATES:** For any order issued under this BOA, the rate will be based on the number of hours of detention. No payment will be made for any detention beyond 48 hours, and the Service Provider will not house the alien for longer than 48 hours under this BOA.

**ALTERATIONS:** Any changes to the terms and conditions of this BOA, with the exception of modification and signed by the Contracting Officer, Changes or Amendments to the BOA shall be made pursuant to the BOA shall be made.

**PAYMENT:** Payments shall be made by purchase order (PO) and (if applicable) the Service Provider's unique Identification Number (TIN) and DUNS number. The Service Provider shall submit invoices to ICE Management (www.ice.dhs.gov) for payment.

**PUBLIC DISCLOSURES:** Information obtained or developed as a result of this BOA is the property of ICE and is subject to public release under the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552) and other laws, regulations, policies, and procedures, including those developed by the Service Provider and any other laws, regulations, policies, and procedures developed by the Service Provider. Such documents shall be subject to public release under the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552) and other laws, regulations, policies, and procedures, including those developed by the Service Provider. The Service Provider receives a 14-day advance notice of any request for information, including requests for information, and the Service Provider will refrain from releasing any information to the public or to any other entity if the Service Provider intends to release the BOA as a result of a request for information. The Service Provider will not release any information to the public or to any other entity if the Service Provider may, at its discretion, release any information to the public or to any other entity.
